### Finance update for HMC

We are now 3 months into our fiscal year. For Sept/Oct/Nov:

- we budgeted to spend \$120,163.36
- actual expenses totaled \$112,639.72
- general offerings totaled \$108,559.65

HMC also received government assistance totalling: \$12,134.71
