Hey everyone! How are you doing today? Beyond the regular "I'm fine" or "I am a bit tired of everything", I want to ask a bit deeper. How are you doing spiritually? Do you feel energized, full of life, like you are growing, and refreshed? Or do you feel tired, empty, and dry?

Lately, the words of Psalm 42:1-2 have been going through my mind a lot. The image of the deer panting for water speaks powerfully to me. The image here is not of a deer that happens to stumble across a spring of water that it wasn't really looking for or wanted, but decides to take a small drink at it. The word "pant" implies a deep and desperate longing. The deer is really thirsty and needs a drink of water for life itself to continue.

And just as that deer pants for water, so the psalmist longs for God. The idea of longing implies suffering thirst. Just like the deer desperately longed for a drink from the spring, so we need to desperately long after God as without Him, our spirits are dry, thirsty, and empty. The question for me is "if I am feeling dry and empty today, and without life, what am I doing to long for God?"

Our youth are still digging into the story of Jonah.

The passage for this week is **Jonah 4:1-4**, take some time to read it and connect with God and follow along with what our youth are learning.

When God spares the Ninevites from destruction Jonah is very upset. It seems like an odd reaction, since one would think God's kingdom being built up and love being displayed would be a cause for great celebration. What we actually read is that Jonah is so upset that he thinks he would rather die than live with the knowledge that his enemies have been offered grace and forgiveness!



Before we condemn Jonah for his ridiculous behaviour however, we should pause and realize that his situation is probably just an extreme example of something we all struggle with in our own hearts. Why are we so ready to accept God's grace and forgiveness for the mistakes we make again and again, yet are so ready to point an accusing finger and condemn others who are also imperfect? Maybe someone else being pushed down gives us the illusion of being raised up a little? Let's reflect on the truth that our status and worth comes not from anything we could ever do, rather from our loving God and creator, king of the universe!

As you read and reflect, here are some questions for you to think about.

- 1. After reading the text, what thoughts or details jump out at you right away?
- 2. Spend a bit of time praying about and reflecting on the text. What is God bringing to your attention?
- 3. How does this passage apply to your life?
