

I have always enjoyed Old Testament stories. There is one is from a book on prayer that has stayed in my memory. It is about Jacob. Jacob & Esau were twins born to Isaac & Rebekah. Esau as the firstborn was entitled to a birthright – a blessing & an inheritance. In a moment of weakness for Esau, Jacob tricked him into selling his inheritance for a bowl of stew. Then later he stole Esau's birthright. When Esau discovered this trickery he vowed to kill Jacob.

Fear gripped Jacob. His mother sent him far away. Jacob was gone for over twenty years but in that time he married & had children. I imagine the date of Esau's birthday would fill him with fear. Whenever someone asked about his family, fear would fill his heart. Then came the day God told Jacob to return home. He shook with fear. Fear was Jacob's problem, not Esau.

Jacob gathered his wives, children, and flocks together and headed home. When he was nearly there he gathered a peace offering for Esau of his best goats, cows, and a Ford Mustang.

That night his bottled up fear took control. His prayer was "please deliver me, please deliver me, I'm scared, help me, I'm scared. "A man wrestled with him until daybreak." (Gen 32:24) We know that it was God who wrestled with Jacob. The fear of Esau and distrust in God that Jacob had been carrying for years needed to be confronted. As dawn was breaking, so was the bondage of Jacob's fear that had held him for two decades.
