15 years ago, when I drove city busses in Vancouver, I would frequently see a homeless fellow at the train station on my way home from work. I remember feeling like I should try to get to know him. And as I debated in my mind if I should, I remember asking God that if he wanted me to try and develop more of a relationship with this guy, tell me his name. And instantly, the name 'Bill' just kept coming to mind. I shrugged it off as just me thinking of a very common man's name. Later that day when I saw him, I gave him my name, and then he told me his -'Bill'

8 years ago, a few days before Caleb was born, I remember how we left the hospital one evening,

thinking that it was going to be the day Caleb would enter this world. They had a planned induction and everything, yet Caleb did not feel like co-operating. After what was a tiring week, and a trying week of planned inductions that kept getting bumped, and thinking that "today might be the day" only to be disappointed, we were tired, discouraged, and a bit annoyed. On the way home, Josh asked "when is baby coming". We, in our frustrated state told him to ask God. So He did quietly in the back seat. All of a sudden, in a clear voice, our five year old son said "God says I am still making your baby and he is not ready yet. He will be here in two days." We shrugged it off a bit, yet wondered if there was more to this 'message'. Two days later, Caleb was born.

All of this is to say, God still does speak, and He cares enough about you to speak into the little things if we are choosing to listen.
